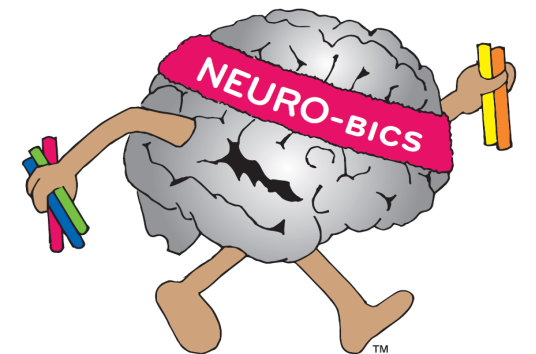

Twenty-six (26%) percent of the total Confederate soldiers who died in the major battles of Civil War were killed in Gettysburg. This infographic provides information on the number of soldiers who died in the major battles of the Civil War. In order to calculate the percentage of Confederate soldiers killed in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania from the total Confederate soldiers who were killed in the Civil War I would need to know how many Confederate soldiers were killed in all the major battles. I looked at the chart and added each of the numbers of Confederate soldiers next to the name of the battle. There were nine battles and nine numbers totaling 106,768 Confederate soldiers who were killed. I divided 28,063, the number of Confederate soldiers who were killed in Gettysburg by 106,768, the total of Confederate soldiers who were killed. The result was 26%.



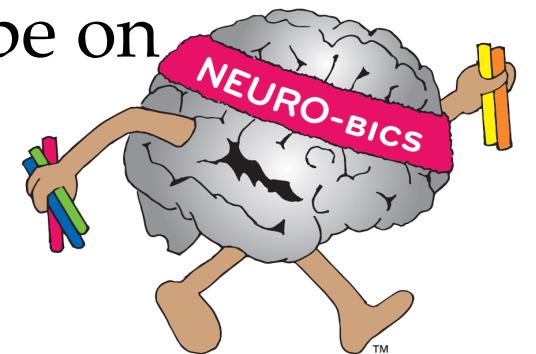

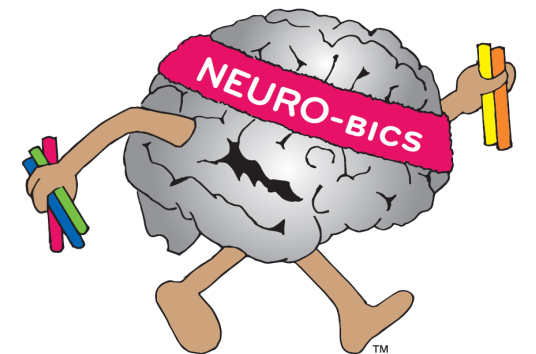

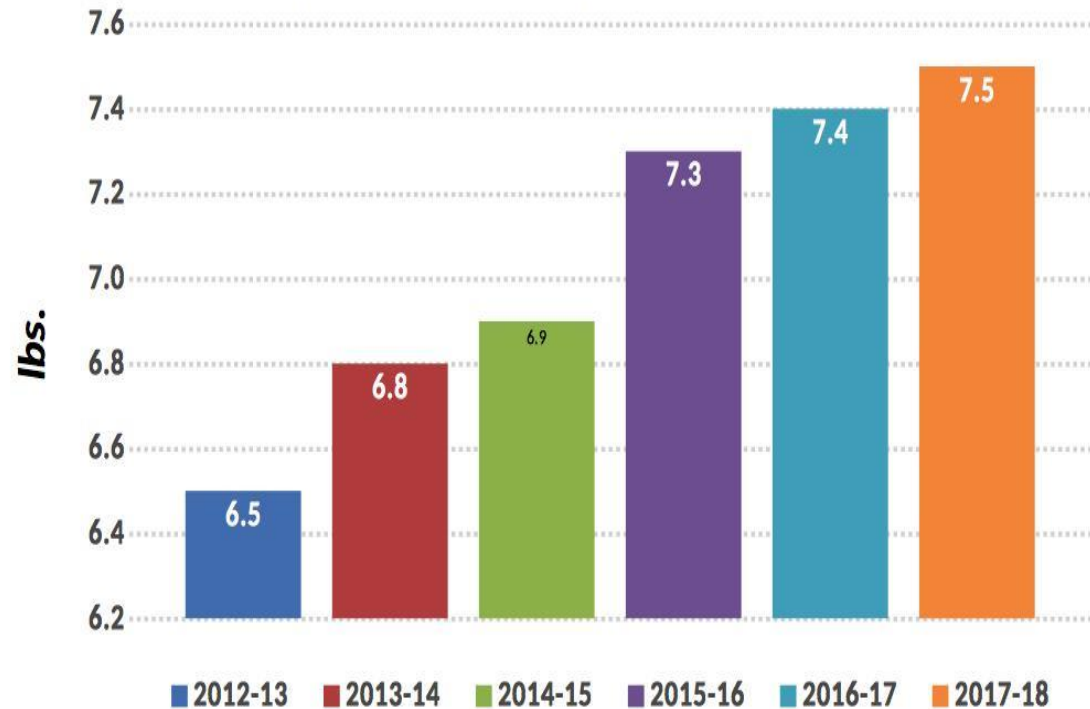

In the article, Heroism of Nine Colored Men, the reporter wrote that 9 colored men-pilot, engineers and crew, the wife and three children of the pilot, Robert Smalls, and the wife, child, and sister of John Smalls, engineer, escaped. To calculate the number of enslaved persons, I added the number 9-pilot and crew and 7-number of family members who accompanied the crew. The total was 16 enslaved persons.

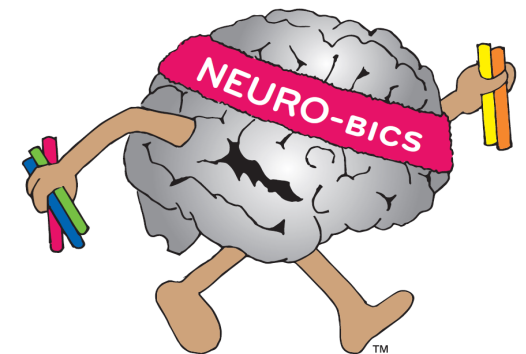
Peanut Per Capita Consumption

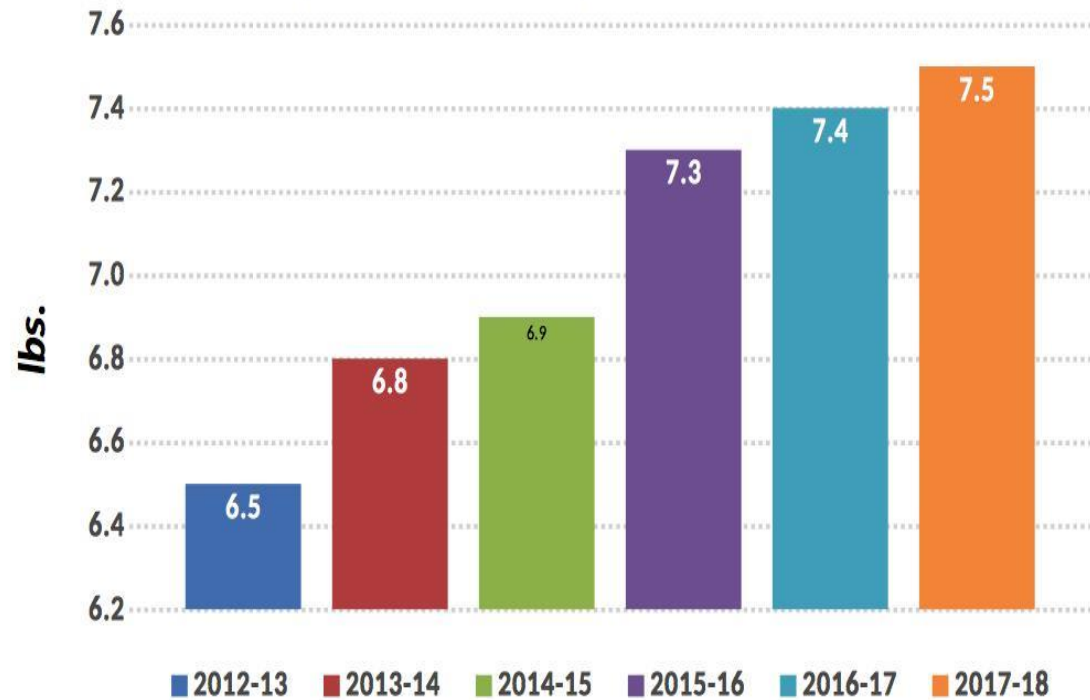

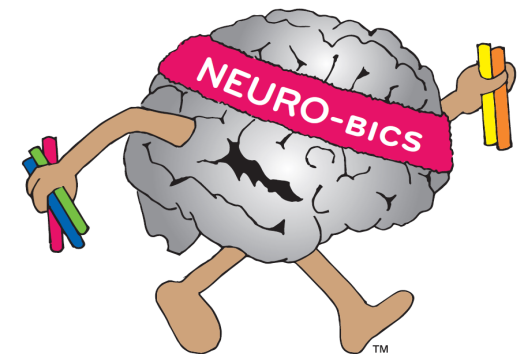
Peanut Per Capita Consumption

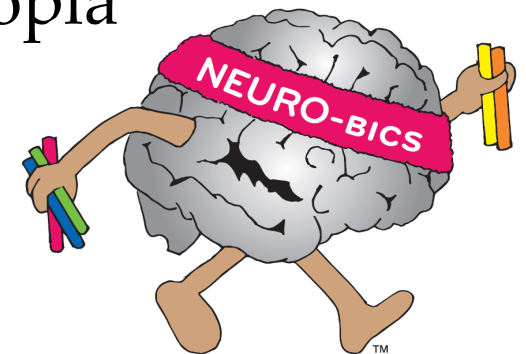

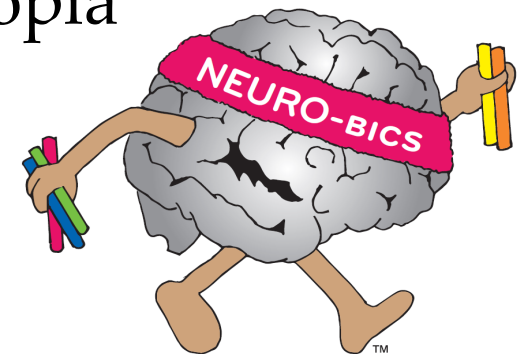

In millions

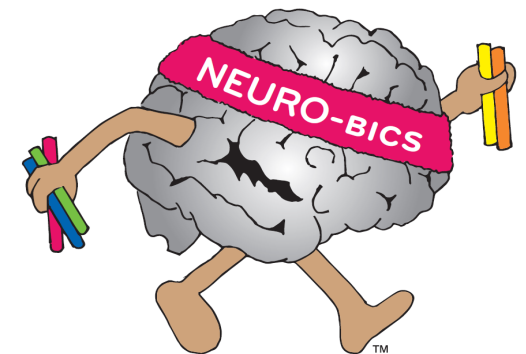

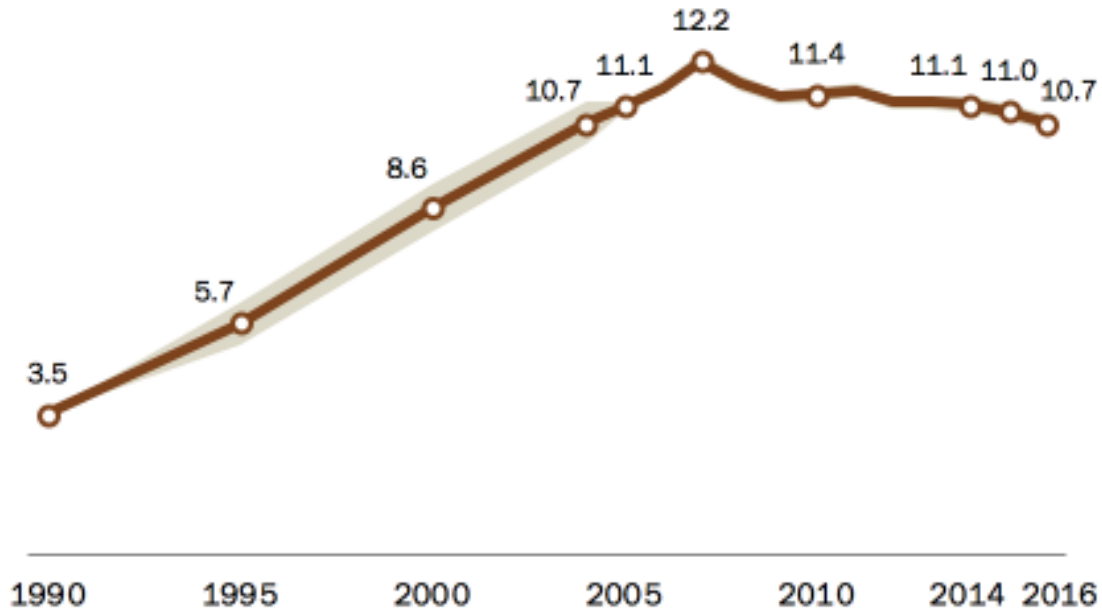

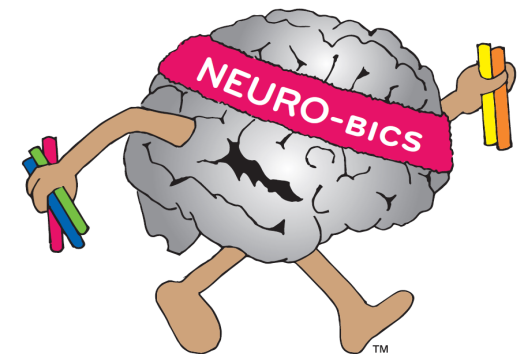
